With your assistance, the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency's (U.S. EPA) implementation of Title III of the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990 can at once build upon California's experience and make it available to other jurisdictions. Since the federal statute in this area is based in part on prior California experience, this is especially appropriate.
