Alternative Diesel Fuels Regulation

Reporting Summary – 2019

The Alternative Diesel Fuels (ADF) regulation, which became effective January 1, 2016, requires regulated parties to report produced, imported, and blended amounts of all biodiesel blendstock and the biodiesel blends produced. The table below is a summary of ADF reporting in 2019 and shows the volumes of B100/B99 blendstock imported and produced, as well as the percentages of B100/B99 blendstock blended to produce final blends of B20 and below.
